The school behaviour policy is designed to help the children to learn to live and learn together in a supportive way, taking responsibility for their own actions and developing self-discipline.

We expect the children to:

- be ready for learning
- be polite at all times
- take responsibility for their behaviour keeping themselves and others safe
- show respect for themselves and others
- show respect for their environment
- understand the purpose of rules
- express opinions in a considerate and thoughtful way

Above all we expect children to

Treat others as they would like to be treated

We support this by:

- promoting a clear understanding of 'right and wrong' and therefore high standards of behaviour
- promoting respect for themselves, their property and that of others
- promoting an environment where everyone is happy, safe and secure
- promoting good relationships, so people can work together with a common purpose of helping everyone to learn whatever learning and emotional difficulties are being displayed
- promoting a community attitude of care and responsibility towards the school and the environment
- promoting British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and acceptance of people of all faiths, races and cultures
- using Emotion Coaching techniques to encourage children to regulate, reflect on and resolve any issues that arise

Parents support this by:

- promoting the same behaviour expectations at home
- being positive role models in treating others as they would like to be treated
- sharing any concerns with school, who can investigate incidents
