### St John's to Japan

This is a geography based topic in which the children will compare our locality of St John's Village to a small area in Japan. We will look at the physical and human geography of St John's. We will also locate it on maps and look at keys by walking around the school.

When looking at Japan, we will use aerial photographs to see how the physical and human geography is similar or different to our own.

In art and design, we will begin by looking at the artist Andy Goldsworthy who uses natural materials to create his artwork. We will use natural materials from our local environment to create our own work inspired by him. We will then learn about the Japanese artist, Yayoi Kusama to learn how to control the use of the brush by drawing dots.

Our DT project will be to make a bird nest which can support an egg. We will look at the best materials to use and think about what is important when building a bird nest, designing and evaluating our ideas before using natural materials to bring our designs to life!
