Breakfast club

To ensure all children start their day in the right way we offer a variety of breakfast options, including a variety of cereals, toasts and spreads, fruit and yogurts with a variety of fruit juice, milk and water. All dietary, allergy and religious food needs are catered for.

We focus on quieter activities in the morning allowing the children to relax before a busy day at school and participate in a variety of board games, arts & crafts, reading and construction toys. Breakfast Club operates from 7.30am until school start.

After School Club

We offer a multi activity experience at our after-school club and the children can expect a variety of activities including multi sports, arts & crafts, baking & cooking, messy play, gardening and planting and so much more. This is to ensure every child's interests are catered for. We plan activities for all age ranges and difficulties allowing the children to challenge themselves and learn new skills and have fun. We also have a full indoor and outdoor set up for the children every day and this allows them to choose how they wish to spend their time. All children are offered a healthy snack with drinking water always available and all dietary, allergy and religious food needs are catered for.





Holiday Clubs

HELP WITH CHILDCARE COSTS

There are multiple options out there to help families with childcare costs to make quality childcare affordable and accessible for you. You can read more about financial options on the Childcare Choices website, on this website you can also find information on how to apply for any of these options and more information on if the options apply to your individual circumstances www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

Tax Free Childcare:

- For working families, including the self-employed, in the UK
 Earning under £100k and at least £152 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each
 Who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers
 With children aged 0-11 (or 0-16 if disabled)
- - For every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year

Working Tax Credits

- For working families, in the UK
- With children under 16 (or under 17 if disabled)
- 70% of childcare costs, up to a cap
- If you cannot make a new claim for Tax Credits, you may be able to apply for Universal Credit instead.

Universal Credit

- For working families claiming Universal Credit, in England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales
- With children under 17^{*}
- Up to 85% of eligible childcare costs
 Who aren't receiving Tax-Free Childcare?

Support While you Study

- Weekly payments from Care to Learn if you're at school or sixth-form college
- Help through your college if you're in further education
- A weekly grant if you're in full-time higher education
- You could get weekly payments through Care to Learn if you're under 20 at the start of a publicly-funded course, such as a school or sixth form.
- You can apply for Discretionary Learner Support to pay for childcare if you're 19 or over and in further education, for example, if you're studying for an NVQ, BTEC or PGCE.
- You can apply for a Childcare Grant if you're in full-time higher education to pay for childcare costs for children under 15 (or under 17 if they have special needs).
