Vision for art and design

The vision for art and design at St John's has been developed though looking at the National Curriculum's purpose for art and design education, the Educational Programme for expressive arts in the EYFS framework takes into consideration our school's purpose for education. It is shaped by our school's curriculum drivers: lead healthy lifestyles (including good mental wellbeing), connect with nature, promote language and vocabulary and our values and our Trust's drivers of 'environment, community and innovation'..

Our vision

Art, craft and design embody some of the highest forms of human creativity. High quality art demands us to consider our 'whole self', our perception of ourselves and consider how we perceive others. Art can contribute enormously to wellbeing through the expression of feelings, thoughts and ideas. Art allows us to foster greater connections with nature; either by being inspired by nature to create art or to use art and design to highlight environmental issues. Art and design can both reflect and shape history and be a vehicle for change. At St John's as artists and designers, we are inspired to make our communities and our environment better thereby building a brighter future

Our art curriculum will engage, inspire and challenge pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. We aim that they come proficient in the knowledge and skills needed for drawing and painting and have an appreciation and experience of a range of other art forms including sculpture, print making, collage and textile art. As artists, our pupils will approach new challenges with a growth mindset, bringing their imagination and creativity to create original works of art. Our pupils will learn to think critically, being able to say what they like and dislike about art, give and receive feedback graciously and learn to appreciate the work of a range of artists and designers.
